GLRC RESEARCHERS IN THE MEDIA

- York University Professor Pat Armstrong was included in two recent news stories on long-term care, drawing on her newly published research report, *Re-imagining Long-term Residential Care in the COVID-19 Crisis.* The first story is from the *Ottawa Citizen* on May 1st: "Long-term care in Canada—what happens when the military goes home?" The second story is from the *Toronto Star* on May 5th: "They said there was no playbook for dealing with COVID-19 outbreak at nursing homes. There were several."
