### **GLRC UPDATES**

We are working on moving and redeveloping the GLRC website to better support our community

### **GLRC RESEARCHERS IN THE MEDIA**

- York University Professor Fay Faraday was <u>featured</u> in the *Toronto Star* for her work on migrant workers: "A study urged better standards for migrant workers' housing. Nothing was done. Now COVID-19 has struck." Professor Faraday was also <u>interviewed</u> for *Global News'* Morning Show, in a segment called "'Out of sight, out of mind': Abuse in migrant work system, despite how essential they are to food supply."
- York University Professor Kelly Pike wrote an <u>op-ed</u> called "Will the Pandemic Set Women Back?"
   on COVID-19's impact on women in developing and emerging economies. The piece was co authored by Beth English (Princeton University) and published by Project Syndicate.
- On January 22, 2020, the GLRC hosted a lecture featuring Dr. Rebecca Tarlau (Pennsylvania State University) where she discussed her book, "Occupying Schools, Occupying Land: How the Landless Workers Movement Transformed Brazilian Education." Dr. Leo Panitch (York University) acted as the discussant, and his review of Dr. Tarlau's book can be found <a href="here">here</a>. Dr. Panitch has also been featured on the Analysis. news podcast in a segment called "The Irrationality of the System Has Been Fully Revealed." Dr. Tarlau has further analyzed how the Landless Workers Movement is

**organizing in the time of COVID-19** in a piece titled "Activist farmers in Brazil feed the hungry and aid the sick as president downplays Coronavirus crisis."

York University Professor Pat Armstrong has made multiple media appearances in recent weeks
for her highly regarded <u>research</u> on long-term care homes. Last week, we linked to two stories she
was featured in from the <u>Ottawa Citizen</u> and the <u>Toronto Star.</u> Professor Armstrong was also
interviewed for CBC Radio.
